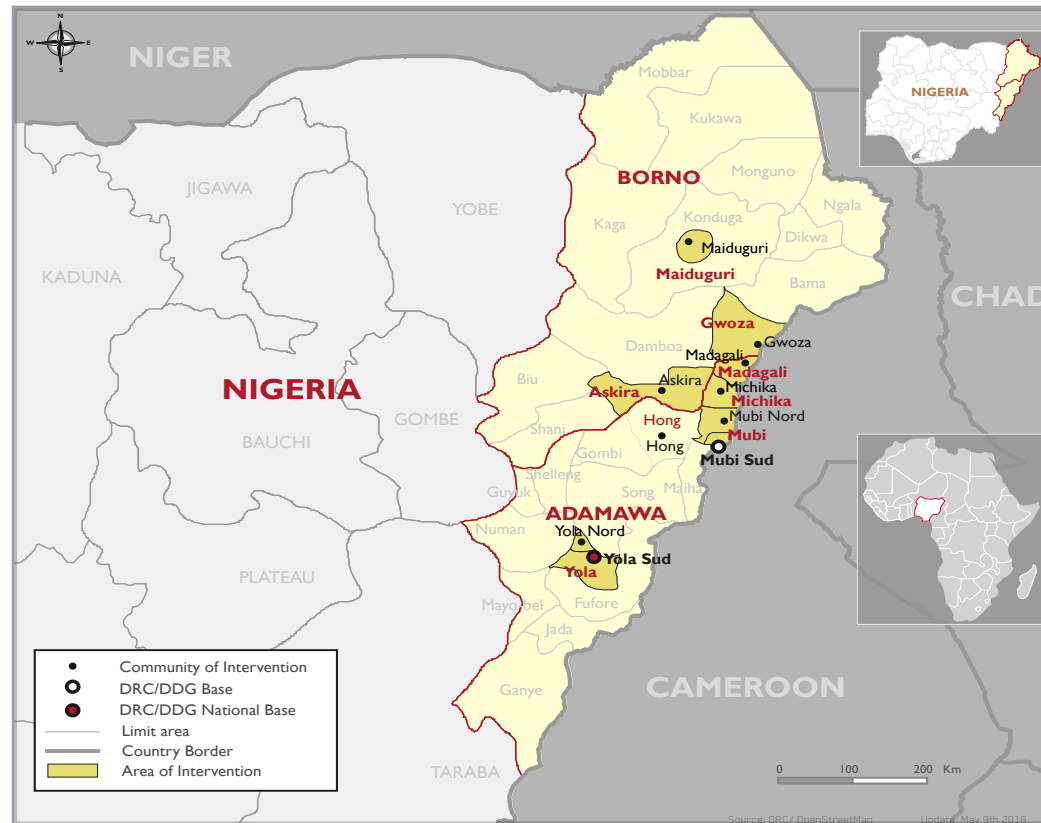




Nigeria's north-east is currently experiencing a significant humanitarian crisis, which has resulted from the ongoing armed conflict between Boko Haram, the Nigerian military and the Multi-National Task Force. An estimated 10 million people are affected by the conflict which has led to a state of emergency being declared in three north-eastern states. There is thus a continuing displacement crisis in the region: it is estimated that over 2.1 million people have been displaced; 67% since 2014 (Protection sector working group Nigeria, October 2015). High insecurity in the region has made access for humanitarian actors extremely difficult, further exacerbating the situation.

The overall objective of DRC/DDG's proposed programme in Nigeria's northeast is to promote stability and resilience among displacement-affected communities. The programme will target Internally Displaced People (IDPs), returnees and host communities, including female-headed households, children, youth and other vulnerable groups, and will be implemented in Adamawa and Borno States.

MINE/ERW RISK EDUCATION

Promoting socio-economic recovery and sustainable livelihoods

- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will provide women with **small-scale trade activities and vocational skills**, in order to strengthen their economic and social self-reliance skills.
- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will provide **assistance packages for small home gardening projects** to IDPs and host families/communities.

Addressing the needs of youth at affected by displacement and at risk of criminality and radicalization

- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will provide youth with **entrepreneurship trainings and start-up materials**, so that they have tangible alternatives to criminality, economic migration and radicalization.
- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will facilitate **cross-generational and inter-faith dialogue** between youth and other members of their community in order to improve collaboration, trust and social cohesion.
- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will **create safe recreational spaces for youth** providing psycho-social support group activities and the possibility to organise cultural, dance and other events.

Enhancing community safety and conflict mediation capacities

- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will work with community members to develop and implement **community safety plans**.
- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will facilitate **dialogue** between communities, security providers and civil authorities.
- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will strengthen the capacity of IDPs and host communities to **peacefully manage and mediate conflicts**.

Reducing the risks associated with mines/explosive remnants of war (ERW)

- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will deliver **mine/ERW risk education sessions** for community members and humanitarian organisations.
- ✓ **DRC/DDG** will provide **recommendations to the government** regarding how to ensure state/national injury surveillance system includes data on mine/ERW-related injuries.
